Delano - A Recent History Part 3

In Part 1, we explained how the businesses and residents of Delano worked together to create a revitalization plan.

In Part 2, we talked about name recognition and how to increase it by including Delano in a tag line in advertising. We also mentioned the need to change a few negative perceptions that some people hold about (the old) Delano.

A large part of the revitalization planning process included identifying Delano's strengths and weaknesses. Delano has a rich and colorful history - starting with it's days as a rough and rowdy cowtown at the end of the Chisholm Trail, continuing through the beginnings of the airplane industry and on to today. What Delano is missing is an identity.

Delano's identity was lost after it was annexed by Wichita - primarily to stop it's reputation as a rowdy, lawless place. Delano became "West Wichita" - just another part of the quickly growing City of Wichita - and it's rowdy history was forgotten. When the revitalization plan was created, only people from older generations had heard of Delano.

Now that there is a plan in place and Delano has some name recognition it is time to develop an identity which can be used for marketing the district. There has been some discussion about this over the past few years, but Delano is a lot of different things to different people.

To some, Delano is a Traditional Neighborhood with large Victorian houses, mature trees and a little business district. To others it is a funky little shopping district with interesting architecture. Visitors are always excited to be standing on the Chisholm Trail and hear about Delano's colorful past.

The challenge will be in developing an image which will encompass as many of Delano's facets as possible.

Questionable Future for Events in Delano

Due to changes in City ordinances that will take effect in January of 2011, it will become much more expensive to put on a parade or other type of public event. Not only have permit fees gone up, there are also new requirements for security.

In the past, we have relied on donations to help cover the costs of our events. More recently we have established an entry fee for the parades but still income barely covers the modest expenses.

Under the new ordinance, the cost of putting on one of our parades will be around \$3,000.00. Larger events would cost even more.

It would be a shame if the parades and the other events were no longer held. For several years they have been part of Delano's identity and they have brought thousands of people to the district.

We want these events to stay free to the public, so the only apparent answer is to find sponsors for each event. We will be attempting to do that.

The 2011 parades we will need sponsors for are:

- **St. Patrick's Parade - March 12, 2011**
- **Christmas Parade - December 3, 2011**
